## ...from the Pastor's Pen...

Dear Friends,

I looked all over the internet for black and white Christian New Year clip art, and of the hundreds of New Year possibilities, I'd say less than 2% are religious in theme. So I settled on a weather icon, instead – very appropriate for the winter weather in our beautiful valley!

But isn't it interesting, so few religious clips as we segue into another year? And of course, the other challenge is that we've needed to use black and white clips because printing in color was impossible with our now-retired printer/copier. The trustees recognized that we needed to replace the copier, so we have leased a new printer with upgraded features, including color printing. We are in the process of learning how to use its many attributes.

Many thanks to Sue and Wes Swayze, who have used the other printer since 2007, keeping it going, unjamming jams, pulling out papers the machine tried to eat, stocking reams of paper from Staples, organizing and printing big projects like monthly Pioneers, Annual Reports, minutes for this and that meeting, and the like.

Over the years they would print the fronts and then flip them manually to print the backs, and then take the stacks home to collate and assemble into packets to be mailed or otherwise distributed. I did some figuring – I've been here for six and a half years, or 78 months. Sending out 200 issues a month (our normal run) = 15,600 issues to collate on the kitchen table. If each issue averages 6 pages (back and front), they have printed and handled 93,600 pages and counting!

And that's just for the Pioneer during my tenure. Adding Annual Reports and other needs to the printing list increases the total. Our new printer will eliminate many of these repetitive tasks.

We don't make a practice of toting up all the recurrent tasks we do for our church, of course, but appreciating one another is so important. Our church, like most, serves God's people mainly through loving and dedicated volunteer effort given freely by members and friends. But it is kind of interesting to see what that effort has produced with regards to the use of the copier!

Our 2018 Annual Meeting is coming up at the end of this month. We will gather again in the Dining Room to share a delicious dish-to-pass meal, review our church finances and activities through 2017, elect new officers and members of committees and boards, consider our goals for 2018, and discuss fundraisers that are especially important now that the Preble Children's Center has closed.

We will also vote on some important considerations and take steps towards revising our bylaws to reflect our current needs. All of this activity supports our growth together as members of God's church and our beloved Preble community and surrounding areas. With a faith-filled future in mind, may 2018 be one of our – and your – best years ever, filled with God's blessings, presence, and strength.

## Preble Children's Center

The Preble Children's Center closed its doors for the last time on December 29, 2017, after almost 45 years in operation. Many factors led to this closure, but the deciding reason was financial. Homer and Tully schools initiated Pre-K programs in September 2017 and the Center saw a loss of over half of their enrollment. The Children's Center was always a mission for the Church and many members of the congregations had their children and grandchildren attend over the years.

As the saying goes, "When one door closes, a window opens," and the trustees are already working on ideas to use the space. Adding a kitchen upstairs and expanding the Food Pantry are a few ideas that have been suggested. The loss of the Center also means a loss of rental income for the Church. This new challenge has the Trustees looking into new ways to generate income.
